The Manual of Tests and Criteria contains criteria, test methods and procedures to be used for classification of dangerous goods according to the provisions of Parts 2 and 3 of the United Nations Recommendations on the Transport of Dangerous Goods, Model Regulations, as well as of chemicals presenting physical hazards according to the Globally Harmonized System of Classification and Labelling of Chemicals (GHS). As a consequence, it supplements also national or international regulations which are derived from the United Nations Recommendations on the Transport of Dangerous Goods or the GHS. At its ninth session (7 December 2018), the Committee adopted a set of amendments to the sixth revised edition of the Manual as amended by Amendment 1. This seventh revised edition takes account of these amendments. In addition, noting that the work to facilitate the use of the Manual in the context of the GHS had been completed, the

Committee considered that the reference to the "Recommendations on the Transport of Dangerous Goods" in the title of the Manual was no longer appropriate, and decided that from now on, the Manual should be entitled "Manual of Tests and Criteria".

However, epidemics are also discussed in the context of migrations, with the special emphasis on the current refugee migrations that affect not only Europe, but also the United States. The book encompasses examples and tools developed for easier, more specific, and faster detection of possible bioterrorism treats, along with proposed actions for some aspects of a bioterrorism attack.

This edition is based on the requirements of Annex 18 to the Convention on International Civil Aviation and the 2007-08 edition of the associated Technical Instructions for the Safe Transport of Dangerous Goods by Air. These Regulations set out procedures for the shipper and the operator by which articles and substances with hazardous properties can be safely transported by air on all commercial air transport. Sections deal with: applicability, limitations, classification, identification, packing, packaging

specifications and performance tests, marking and labelling, documentation, handling, and radioactive material. This is the 48th edition of this title and comes into effect on 1 January 2007, replacing the 47th edition (2006, ISBN 9291955809).
